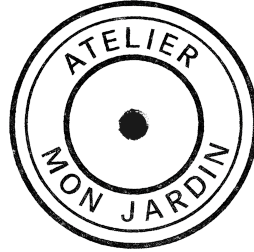

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I . PRACTICE

1. Overview

Atelier Mon Jardin is an independent advisory practice operating at the intersection of philanthropy strategy, ecosystem navigation, and operational execution.

The practice emerges from years of hands-on work across philanthropic research, advisory mandates, platform development, and international collaboration, combining academic grounding with field execution.

Rather than offering standardised consultancy services, the Atelier operates as a tailored practice supporting organisations in aligning vision, navigating ecosystems, and executing sustainable philanthropic strategies across geographies and partnerships.



2. Focus and Delivery

The practice operates through a structured intervention framework transforming organisational intent into operational results.

INPUT

Organisations bring missions, projects, partnerships, or expansion ambitions requiring clarification, positioning, or execution.

FOCUS AREAS

The practice works across three operational domains:
Strategic alignment and ecosystem positioning
Partnership and funding ecosystem development
Operational structuring and programme execution support

OUTPUT

Organisations gain operational clarity, structured partnerships, and executable pathways aligned with their mission and ecosystem context.

OUTCOME

Stronger positioning, sustainable collaborations, and long-term philanthropic or programme impact capacity.



3. Engagement Model

Collaborations are structured according to organisational needs, mandate scope, and implementation complexity.

Engagements typically take one of the following forms:

- Strategic advisory mandates supporting organisational positioning and decision-making
- Operational implementation support for programmes, partnerships, or ecosystem expansion
- Hybrid advisory-execution formats accompanying organisations through transition or growth phases
- Short-term diagnostic or ecosystem assessment engagements supporting strategic entry decisions

N.B. Engagement models adapt to organisational maturity, ecosystem conditions, and operational scope, allowing flexible collaboration formats.

Engagements may operate through:

- Project-based mandates with defined scopes and timelines
- Retainer-based advisory collaborations
- Long-term strategic and operational mandates
- Participation in tenders or institutional mandate processes
- Temporary integration within organisations where execution support is required
- Collaboration structures across Swiss or international legal entities when projects involve multiple jurisdictions

N.B. Engagements operate exclusively under transparent billable-hour structures aligned with Swiss philanthropy best practices. Commission-based fundraising or success-fee arrangements are not pursued, ensuring independence and full alignment with organisational interests



4. Selected Practice Examples

The practice has supported organisations and initiatives across different operational contexts, including:

- Market and ecosystem entry strategies for organisations expanding philanthropic or programme activities across geographies
- Strategic and operational structuring of foundations, programmes, and hybrid philanthropic initiatives
- Partnership and funding ecosystem development connecting organisations with aligned collaborators and grant-making actors
- Programme and mandate performance structuring to strengthen delivery capacity and operational clarity
- Advisory and implementation support during organisational transition, restructuring, or growth phases



II. SYSTEMS

1. Methodology & Workflows

Operational Approach

The practice operates through structured workflows translating strategy into operational execution. Engagements begin with ecosystem and organisational diagnosis, followed by alignment, operational structuring, and execution support.

Engagement Structure

Work typically unfolds across phases:

- Situation and ecosystem analysis
- Strategic and partnership alignment
- Operational structuring and execution support
- Knowledge transfer and autonomy enablement

Delivery Processes

Interventions combine advisory, coordination, and practical implementation support, ensuring that outputs remain operationally usable rather than purely strategic recommendations.



2. Systems & Tools Integration

Project and Collaboration Systems.

The practice integrates project coordination, partnership management, and operational workflows to ensure collaboration across stakeholders, teams, and geographies.

Data Structuring & Operational Flows.

Work includes structuring ecosystem intelligence, partner landscapes, funding environments, and organisational workflows, enabling informed decision-making and scalable programme execution.

3. PhilSolution – Operational Platform

Software Architecture Concept

PhilSolution was designed by Abel Mon Jardin as an operational environment designed to reduce fragmentation between project management, ecosystem data, CRM functions, and collaboration tools used in philanthropic operations.

The platform integrates:

- Ecosystem and partner databases
- Project and mandate tracking
- Collaboration and workflow coordination
- CRM and relationship management structures
- Client Support Environment



PhilSolution supports advisory mandates and operational collaboration, enabling organisations and teams to coordinate work, partnerships, and programme execution more efficiently.

N.B. PhilSolution serves primarily as an internal operational environment designed to enhance coordination, data governance, and delivery efficiency across mandates. Its use is not mandatory for client engagements, and collaborations can operate fully within client-side systems where preferred. Platform integration is applied only when it improves operational clarity, collaboration efficiency, and data protection standards.

4. Transferable Systems

Capacity Transfer.

A core objective of engagements is enabling organisations to internalise operational systems and workflows rather than depend on external advisory support.

Sustainable Operational Structuring.

The practice supports organisations in building sustainable internal structures allowing long-term autonomy, partnership development, and programme execution capacity.



III. NETWORK

Execution capacity and ecosystem relationships

1. Network Overview

Atelier Mon Jardin operates through a stable operational core complemented by a trusted professional ecosystem developed across years of advisory work, research collaboration, and international mandates.

The practice combines a small but highly efficient core team with a broader network of professional partners and ecosystem actors activated according to mandate needs.

This structure allows the practice to remain agile while maintaining execution capacity across research, advisory, operational coordination, and system development.

The network operates across four complementary layers.



2. Core Collaborators

Operational Core Team
